## BCEA YEAR END AWARDS POINTS CHART AND CRITERIA

**Note:** Starters are all those competitors that start the competition by entering the competition dressage arena. Eliminations are considered starters.

### YEAR END AWARDS CRITERIA

1. Must be a current BCEA member in good standing and a BC resident.
2. Points will be earned as the same horse/rider combination for all divisions, Pre-Entry and up in the current competition year.
  - 2a. Year end points - all competition results will be separated senior from junior (see # 8, 9 & 10 below)
  - 2b. Combined divisions - points earned at a sanctioned combined division will earn year end awards points at the level of the combined division X-country test.
  - 2c. Intermediate horse/rider combinations earning points at BC Intermediate competitions will earn double (x2) points. Intermediate horse/rider combinations placing as per BCEA points chart at out of province Intermediate &/or FEI 3\* competitions will earn points at the stated points chart level.
3. Horse/Rider combinations - riders may qualify for year end awards points on more than 1 horse in the same or different divisions. ie: same rider competing 2 or more horses will earn points for each horse/rider combination.

- 3a. Horse/Rider combinations must remain the same to gain points for year end awards. ie: if a horse has a new rider, that combination will now gain points together. NOTE: points are not transferable if a horse has a new rider.
4. Upgrading/downgrading - horse/rider combinations that either upgrade or downgrade during the current year will earn year end awards points in each division as per the points chart.
5. Current year - points earned during the current year apply to the current year.
6. Championship competition BONUS POINTS - because championship riders are often mixed into the regular open division at the championship event site, the horse/rider combinations that have qualified and are competing in the champs division will receive year end awards points for their placing in that champs division AND will also receive year end awards points for their placing in the open division. NOTE: If the championship division is separated completely from the open division, championship riders will receive year end awards points at double points as per the points chart.
7. Ties - all final year end awards ties will be broken. i.e.: combination with the most first placings will lead, if still tied combination with the most second placings and so on until the tie is broken. If still tied, the combination with the best scores as above will break the tie.
8. Juniors - junior or young rider horse/rider combinations that are competing in an open division will receive year end awards points for their placing in that open division as per the points chart. Juniors or young riders competing in a junior or young rider division that is dedicated to them only will receive year end awards points as per the points chart.
9. Junior age - as per the Equestrian Canada section D rule book for Pre-Entry, Entry, and Pre-Training divisions until the end of the current year in which they reach the age of 18 years. For Training division, they must be at least 12 years of age until the end of the current year in which they reach 18 years. For Preliminary division, they must be 14 years of age as of January 1st of the current year until the end of the year in which they reach the age of 18 years. For the Intermediate division, they must be 16 years of age as of January 1st of the current year until the end of the year in which they reach the age of 18 years.
10. Young Riders - until the end of the current year in which they reach the age of 25 years (FEI 16 to 21 years).
11. Year End Points Standings will be posted on the HTBC website throughout the season on a regular basis.
12. Year End Awards and Prizes will be handed out at the HTBC AGM and Year End Awards Banquet.

PLEASE NOTE: The above information for Juniors is a guideline only. The Equestrian Canada Rule Book, section D, article D104 and annex 1, always takes precedence over these guidelines.
