The Education Committee of BCEA is pleased to present this clinic to be held at Johvale Stables (Pritchard) May 17th -19th, 2024

ENTRIES OPEN on MARCH 15th (entry forms will be available online)

THE **REGULAR** CLINIC IS OPEN TO ALL BCEA MEMBERS (regular and non competitive supporting members)
REGARDLESS OF AGE OR LEVEL OF COMPETITION.

**** The Non Competitive Supporting Membership (NCSM) allows participation in ALL BCEA Clinics and Camps (Education, Adult Riders and Young Riders) and gives you voting rights. It is available for purchase (\$25) on the HCBC website when you purchase your Horse Council membership. This membership does NOT allow for participation in competitions.**

In order to participate in this clinic, **ALL** riders must obtain (prior to the clinic) either a Full or Non-Competitive Supporting **Membership for BCEA** (or out of province equivalent) and a **Horse Council BC** membership (or out of province equivalent). This can be done online at www.bceventing.ca or www.hcbc.ca. Out of province riders add \$25 to clinic registration fee.

If you are a rider from any discipline and have not competed in more than 2 Starter divisions at Horse Trials, or if you haven't ridden for years and need a total refresher, you are invited to participate in the **Introduction to Eventing** clinic.

Please read this information carefully. Use the checklist on the entry form to ensure your entry is complete before sending.

NOTE:, The appropriate **BCEA/JOHVALE ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY** form must be signed and initialled. One form is for adults over the age of majority (age 19 on or before January 1st, 2024). and the other must be completed by a parent or guardian for riders who have not reached the age of majority

OTHER IMPORTANT CLINIC ITEMS: PLEASE NOTE - In order to participate in this clinic, you must be prepared to ride out of an arena, in a group, over uneven terrain.

The clinic (all levels) will be cross-country instruction with warm up in stadium. The length of time spent in stadium instruction will be decided by the clinicians, based on competency level of participants. Every effort will be made to limit groups to 4 (maximum 5) riders. Groups will be 1 ½ hours in length.

BCEA does our best to provide clinicians who uphold our philosophy and mission statement. If your clinic experience is not meeting your expectations, we encourage you to discuss your concerns with the onsite BCEA representative (Debbie Dorosh) after your first session. Please do not bother the property owners with any concerns unless you have first discussed them with BCEA (the organizers of this clinic).

If you have any medical concerns that we should be aware of please indicate this with your entry and advise the onsite representative BEFORE you get on your horse.

ATTENTION YOUNG RIDERS: Young Rider subsidies will be available as a \$50 reimbursement to those who sign up and participate in the BCEA spring clinic set-up and / or take down or other BCEA volunteer opportunities. YRs must be current registered BCEA and YR members. The volunteer duties must be signed off by the YR volunteer coordinator who will be announced before the clinic. YR membership forms are available on the BCEA website.

Please do not send the YR membership form with your clinic entry!

Introduction to Eventing ** There will be a lecture at lunchtime on Friday.

Parents and/or coaches are strongly encouraged to attend.

- **Pace Clinic** will be offered – Cost is \$30 for one or \$40 for two days. Sign up times for the pace clinic will be posted on site. Prepayment is appreciated to ensure availability. Not available unless participating in the clinic.
- **Dressage Lessons** will be offered on Thursday May 16th with overflow on Friday, May 17th.
 - Clinician is **Sarah Bradley**.
 - Cost is \$90 for private or \$75 for semi-private (semi is not available for Eventing Pre-Training level or above riders)
 - 45-minute lesson. Sign up on entry form.

SUBSIDY - Vancouver Island Riders and those travelling more than 400km one way

If funds permit, the Education Committee will again offer a subsidy for BC riders who live on and are travelling with their horse from Vancouver Island as well as to any rider who is travelling more than 400 km one way with their horse to Johvale. This \$100 subsidy is for any FULL 2024 or NCSM BCEA member (as of April 1st, 2024). The subsidy will be awarded on a first come basis and distributed by e-transfer to eligible riders AFTER the clinic. **A maximum of 8 subsidies may be available** – Only one subsidy per rider or household will be granted. A subsidy application must accompany your **COMPLETED** clinic entry along with proof of BCEA membership and FULL clinic fee.

Please NOTE: Requests will be met to the best of the entry secretary’s ability, beginning with the highest-level riders. However please note **YOU MAY NOT GET YOUR REQUESTED CLINICIAN**. All are welcome to observe all groups.
